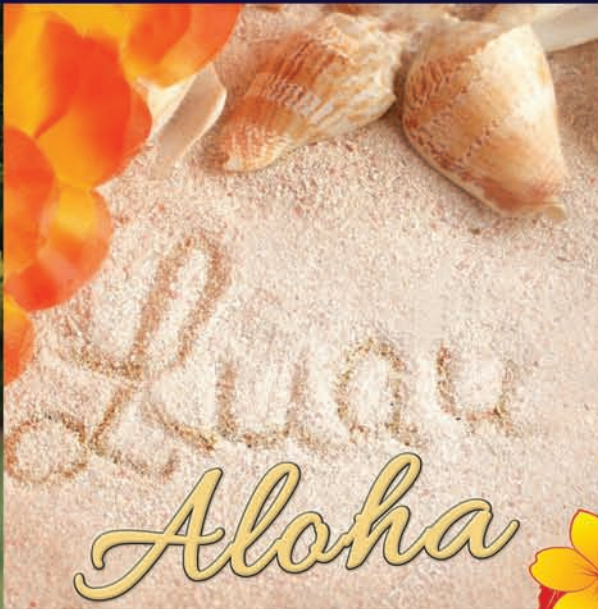

Resident Focus Hank and Lola Gillebaard

There are two things about Hank and Lola that you may not know. But first let's begin their story by telling you that Hank was born in Detroit Michigan, January 8th, 1927. His parents were from Holland, hence the name Gillebaard (Hank says it means "yelling beard" - go figure!). His father, Auke, was a builder's supply dealer. At this point Lola chimed in saying, "When we got married, the lady from the newspaper called me and said, but Lola, I can't put that name it spells "Auke" which is a slang word in English - it means 'jeepers'!" Hank smiled and said his dad would have liked that. Hanks mother was Maria Theresa, who worked as a secretary in Holland, the same place her husband worked as a laborer. That's where they fell in love. But since they "married out of class" as Hank described, they moved to America to get away from any scrutiny. After three children were born in America (yes, Hank was born in America) the family moved back to Holland where Hank was raised.

Lola Dawson (maiden name) was born in Rocky Mount, North Carolina, March 15th, 1930 (the town is about an hour and a half east of Raleigh, the capital). Anyone that has spoken to her has heard that Southern drawl. Lola's father, Mickey, was a pharmacist. In fact, Mickey and his brother owned the only pharmacy in town with a soda fountain, which we will see later in our story comes in handy. Lola's mother, Sudie Louise, was a superintendent of schools. Hank says, "She was strict, even to me!"

When asked what was interesting about her early life, Lola shared that she only weighed a pound and a half when she was born, and there were no incubators at that time! Lola was born at home and the doctors warned her parents that she wouldn't live a week. But her mother rigged a closet up with warming lights all around and that's where she kept Lola for 13 months. Well thanks to her mother, the odds were defied and Lola thrived and is here today. Hank says, "That's because she knew I needed her."

As a small child Lola's interests were limited because she had to wear an ugly brace until she was 14 years old. Lola had to figure out some way to fit in. She decided that if people enjoyed being around her, or laughed when she was around, they didn't care what she looked like, or what she wore. Also, remember how her father was the only one that owned that soda fountain in town? Lola took all her friends there and they didn't have to pay! How's that for getting people to like you! But then one day her father took her in the back of the store and said, "Cutie, this is how I earn a living, it's how we have a car and pay for things." So Lola "got it", and from then on only took a couple of friends at a time.

The Wedding Day of Hank and Lola Gillebaard

While driving her to the first grade, one day Lola said to her mother, "If anyone asks me what's wrong with my leg, I'll tell them it's none of their business." Her mother said, "If you do that when we get home I'll wear you out." That's a southern expression that she would be punished. Her mother explained that if they asked her it's because they were interested. Lola needed to be polite and just explain. Every day when her mother picked her up, she said, "Did anybody ask you, did they?" And Lola told her, "no". That's when Lola learned nobody really noticed or cared.

When Hank was growing up in Amsterdam, Holland, he first went to a public school then his dad took him to a Christian school. He was always in trouble because he was playful. He was liked by every teacher he ever had, but they all had a different way of punishing him when he did something out of the ordinary. That gave him a certain amount of freedom, but also respect. Hank started carving airplanes, and ended up with the entire collection of

Dutch airplanes ever made. Anthony Fokker (a Dutch aviation pioneer) Hank explains, was the main plane manufacturer in Holland and all throughout Europe. Fokker was to Europe as Lindberg was to the U.S.

Hank says he learned his Holland history well. He explained that Holland is a very small country in Europe, less than one third the size of California, with

approximately 13 million people at the time he was a boy. However, because the Dutch were the great sailors of Europe small colonies have sprung up all across the world. "One third of Holland is basically underwater - below sea level" Hank shared. Also, Holland was occupied twice. The first time by the Spaniards (15 to 16th century) later, Germans occupied it during WWII.

So how did these two trans-world people meet? They had to think about this, as it's been 60 years! Lola said she went to college and was going for her teaching degree, but, as she explains, she didn't end up with her degree at the time of graduation. Why? She didn't like the teacher who would put her through her final year as a practice teacher! Instead Lola got a job at a radio station to be

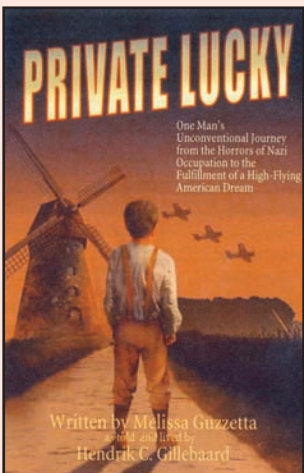

So, again, how exactly did Hank and Lola meet? Lola tells the story of finishing her practice teaching and looking for a job. She got two job offers, one in Charlotte and the other in Kinston, North Carolina. Lola wanted to go to Charlotte as it was the only big city in North Carolina at the time. Her mother said she should go to Kinston because it was close to Rocky Mount, and she thought Lola would meet a nice Kinston boy, fall in love and get married. Lola agreed and took the job in Kinston. Soon after, Lola read in the Kinston paper that there was a meeting in a bank building to start a little theater in Kinston. She found some people who wanted to go and went with them. Well, there was Hank. He was gathering up the papers everyone was filling out. Lola remembers that Hank's hair was longer, while she was used to crew cuts. Hank was gathering up all the papers and Lola wondered why he was such an eager beaver. The next night Hank called her. Hank said, "Hello this is Hank Gillebaard and I was wondering if I can take you out for coffee." Lola said, "How did you get my number?" Hank said, "Well, that's why I gathered up all those papers last night!" Lola laughed and said, "Well, how many numbers are you calling?" Hank said, "About four." Lola said, "Well, what number am I?" Hank said, "You're number one!" Lola said, "Sure I am!" Hank again asked if they could go out for coffee but Lola explained that she was sorry, but they hadn't been properly introduced. There was a long pause. Hank said, "Are you serious?" Lola said, "Yes". They hung up and Lola went back to what she was doing. Then about 15 minutes later Lola's landlord came to her room and said, "Lola you have a gentleman caller." Lola went down to the door and there stood Hank and a friend. The friend said, "Lola this is Hank, Hank this is Lola."

When Lola explained it was "someone" she'd met in Kinston, that he was from Holland, and he was a pilot, Lola's mother said, "You're not interested in him are you?" Lola assured her she wasn't. Then Hank came to pick Lola up. He pranced in, got down on his knee and kissed Lola's mother's hand. Lola said while it didn't mean that much to her then, looking back now she knows that's when her mother "fell in love" with Hank.

Hank and Lola did start that little theater. Hank got the male lead and Lola got the female lead. Each practice Hank picked Lola up and brought her home. Lola said it was a wonderful courtship. They really got to know each other well. At this point Hank says, "And a year later we were married."

The couple went on to live in quite a few states. They had four boys, Hank, Gus, Paul and Ted. Then, from 1974 until 2015 they lived in Laguna Beach. In December of 2014 they suffered an automobile accident. Lola got whiplash, but then a sore appeared on her heel that would not heal. She had already been walking with a walking stick (cane). That's when the two decided it was time to

change their way of living. They moved into another assisted living community but there wasn't enough room. Their son Gus works with handicapped children and knew a lot of places, Lola explained, and brought them to the Villas for a tour. They thought it was great. Lola said "I thought it was classy, light, airy, busy, fun." In addition, the dancing for Hank was appealing to Lola. She noticed the piano in the lobby for Hank. They were sold. And the rest as we say is history!

Oh, but we didn't tell you the two things you don't know about Hank and Lola. Did you know that Lola is a professional comedienne? In 1981 she started teaching at Saddleback. She met someone in the audience who told her she should join the National Speaker's Association. She joined and began to do motivational presentations and met a lot of comics. Soon she was billed as a "motivational humorist". She really loved the comedy part and entered some contests. She ended up winning an eight-week long contest where she was named "The funniest female in California"!

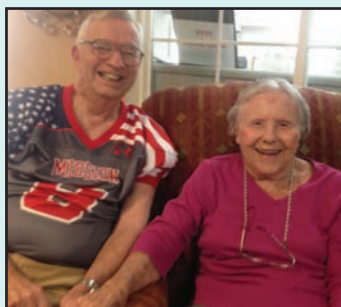

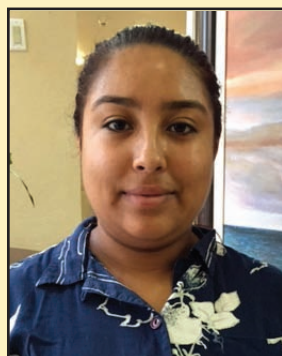

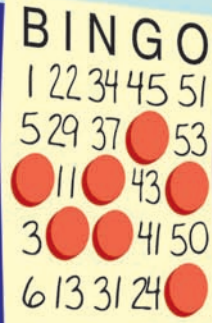
